There followed an ordinary meeting of the Henbury and Brentry Community Council.

**1. Ward report**

- Neighbourhood Renewal - Derek and Claire reported that money had been allocated to Henbury and Brentry from the government to address community safety issues. Following discussion it was agreed that the majority of money be should be spent on up-grading the Crow Lane CCTV system.

- A bid was being developed for CCTV on Station Rd in order to be prepared should a funding opportunity arise.
- An application for a Dispersal Order for Crow Lane and Station Rd is being progressed.
- The community will have Police Community Support Officers working in Henbury and Brentry from the autumn.
- Following the recent vicious assaults in the Station Rd area, the cllrs had lobbied the police for more police resources. There have been additional mounted and dog patrols in the area.

## **2. Library report**

Helen outlined a new scheme which gives books to 2 and 3 year olds. She also talked about the 'books on prescription' scheme. The fascias on the library are being replaced.

## **3. AOB**

- It was agreed that Richard Pyle should be the spokesperson for the council in relation to the Friends of the Suburban Bristol Railways organisation who are lobbying to maintain and improve our local railway system.
- Tim Parkinson informed the meeting that the Community Council web-site is now under development.
- It was noted that the Brentry Community Council Building Trust was to be wound up due to the inability to raise the balance of funding required. It was noted that many people had invested a lot of time and expertise into the project.
- Roy Pepworth reminded members about the Henbury Healthy Walking Group. Everyone welcome.
