Meeting held on 18<sup>th</sup> October, 2007.

16 Persons were present.

**APOLOGIES** were received from Maddy Powell, Ted Marshall, Ray Thomas, Tim Parkinson, Cllr Mark Weston, Paul Thompson, Father Michael Walsh, Nick Merrick and Pat Lee.

The chairman asked if the Police could present their report first as they were involved in an investigation and would like to leave the meeting to carry out their duties. This was agreed. The police reported 16 arrests since March with 7 motor bikes seized. There were less calls for ASBOs recently. Mr Brown raised the question of parents taking children to Blaise School parking on the grass on Barnards Park with the result that the grass was being ruined and would get worse in the wet months ahead, The police would watch this carefully. Richard Pyle pointed out that the no entry into Tranmere Avenue was being abused by 4x4 vehicles who were mounting the raised pavements to achieve access.

Rob Benning from Bristol City Council spoke on preventing smoking in the home with posters and leaflets. He asked for advice from the floor but none was forthcoming.

Sam Parker spoke on Neighbourhood Partnerships and that Henbury and Brenty would be linked with Southmead with Councillors being the link. Richard Pyle doubted the benefits of being linked with Southmead and felt that Lawrence Weston or Kings Weston would be more appropriate..

Whilst Councillor Derek Pickup was not at this meeting he had express his feelings that wards should be kept separate.
